 - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

NOTE: This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Infrastructure and equipment

1. The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

Emissions and discharges

Dust emissions

2. The licence holder must ensure that no visible dust generated from the primary activities crosses the premises boundary.
3. The licence holder must manage dust generation at the premises by:
 - (a) wetting down unsealed roads and exposed areas with a water truck;
 - (b) limiting all vehicle traffic within the premises to speeds of less than 20 km/hr; and
 - (c) ceasing dust-generating activities during strong wind conditions in an easterly direction.

Noise emissions

4. The licence holder must ensure that operations at the premises only occur between the hours of 07:00 to 19:00, and on the days of Monday through to Saturday.

Records and reporting

5. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
6. The licence holder must:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 90 days after the end of that annual period an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.
7. The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
 - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence; and
 - (c) complaints received under condition 5 of this licence.
8. The books specified under condition 7 must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

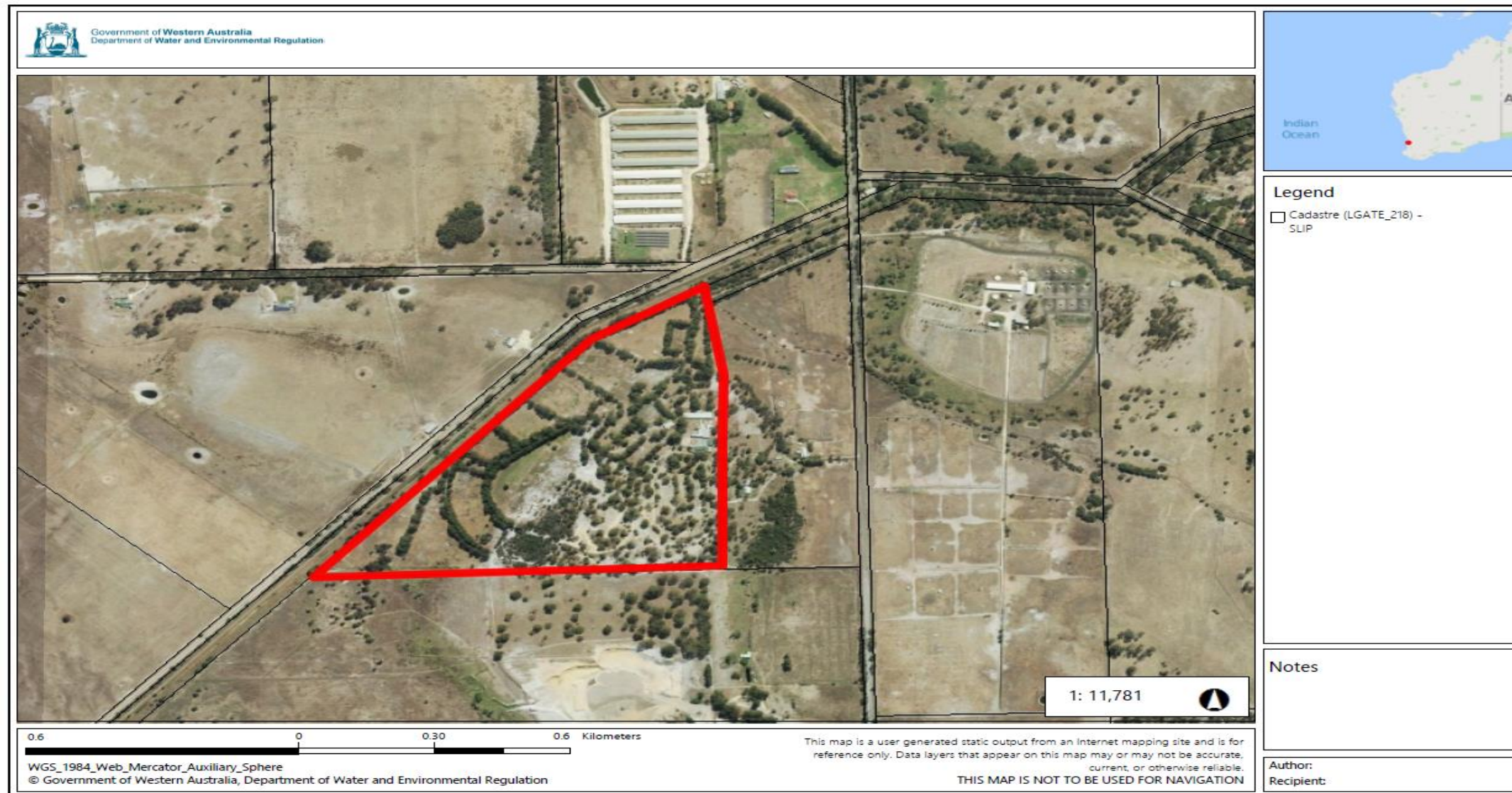


Figure 1: Map of the boundary of the prescribed premises

The boundary of the prescribed premises is shown in the map below (Figure 1).
