## Interpretation

In this licence:

- (a) the words 'including', 'includes' and 'include' in conditions mean "including but not limited to", and similar, as appropriate;
- (b) where any word or phrase is given a defined meaning, any other part of speech or other grammatical form of that word or phrase has a corresponding meaning;
- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition;
- (d) any reference to an Australian or other standard, guideline, or code of practice in this licence:
  - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
  - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

**NOTE:** This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

## **Licence conditions**

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

### Infrastructure and equipment

**1.** The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

#### Table 1: Infrastructure and equipment requirements

Excavator (up to 50 tonnes) with crushing bucket capable of 70mm aggregate output	<ul> <li>(a) Crusher bucket attachment must not be used outside of daylight hours;</li> <li>(b) Must be fitted with noise controls where necessary; and</li> <li>(c) Must be maintained and operated in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.</li> </ul>
2.	Water cart	(a) Must be sufficiently maintained and available to suppress dust on the premises during operational hours.

### Waste Acceptance

- 2. The licence holder must only accept onto the premises waste of a type that:
  - (a) does not exceed the rate at which that waste is received; and
  - (b) meets the relevant acceptance specification,

as set out in Table 2.

**3.** The licence holder must ensure that where waste does not meet the waste acceptance criteria set out in Table 2, it is removed from the premises by the delivery vehicle or, where that is not possible, stored in a quarantined storage area and removed to an appropriately authorised facility within 14 calendar days.

## Waste Processing

**4.** The licence holder must ensure that the waste types specified in Table 3 are only subjected to the corresponding processes, subject to the corresponding process limits and/or specifications.

### **Emissions and Discharges**

- **5.** The licence holder must ensure that sediment laden stormwater resulting from concrete crushing is not discharged outside Chevron's lease area.
- **6.** The licence holder must ensure that dust emitted from the premises does not unreasonably interfere with the health, welfare, convenience, comfort, or amenity of any person who is not on the premises.

## Monitoring

- 7. The licence holder must record the total amount of material:
  - (a) accepted onto the premises;
  - (b) currently stored on the premises; and
  - (c) removed from the premises,

for the material types listed in Table 4, in the corresponding unit, and for each corresponding time period set out in Table 4.

### **Records and reporting**

- 8. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
  - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
  - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
  - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
  - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **9.** The licence holder must:
  - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form by 31 August 2023.
- **10.** The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
  - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
  - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence;
  - (c) monitoring programs undertaken in accordance with condition 7 of this licence; and
  - (d) complaints received under condition 8 of this licence.
- **11.** The books specified under condition 10 must:
  - (a) be legible;
  - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
  - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
  - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
