Interpretation

In this works approval:

 - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
 - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

NOTE: This works approval requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this works approval.

Works approval conditions

The works approval holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Construction phase

Infrastructure and equipment

- **1.** The works approval holder must:
 - (a) construct and/or install the infrastructure;
 - (b) in accordance with the corresponding design and construction / installation requirements; and
 - (c) at the corresponding infrastructure location as set out in Table 1.

Compliance reporting

- 2. The works approval holder must within 30 calendar days of an item of infrastructure or equipment required by condition 1 being constructed and/or installed:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the requirements of condition 1; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Environmental Compliance Report on that compliance.
- **3.** The Environmental Compliance Report required by condition 2, must include as a minimum the following:
 - (a) certification by the site manager that the items of infrastructure or component(s) thereof, as specified in condition 1, have been constructed in accordance with the relevant requirements specified in condition 1;
 - (b) as constructed plans and a detailed site plan for each item of infrastructure or component of infrastructure specified in condition 1; and
 - (c) be signed by a person authorised to represent the works approval holder and contains the printed name and position of that person.

Time limited operations phase

Commencement and duration

- 4. The works approval holder may only commence time limited operations for an item of infrastructure identified in condition 1 where the Environmental Compliance Report as required by condition 2 has been submitted by the works approval holder for that item of infrastructure.
- **5.** The works approval holder may only conduct time limited operations for an item of infrastructure specified in condition 1:
 - (a) for a period not exceeding 180 days from the day the works approval holder meets the requirements of conditions 2 for that item of infrastructure; or

(b) until such a time as a licence for that item of infrastructure is granted in accordance with Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, if one is granted before the end of the period specified in condition 5(a).

Time limited operations requirements

6. During time limited operations, the works approval holder must ensure that the premises infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 2 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operations requirement set out in Table 2

- 7. The works approval holder must ensure that operation of the crushing and screen plants at the premises only occurs between the hours of 07:00 and 18:00, and on the days of Monday through to Saturday.
- **8.** The works approval holder must ensure that no visible dust generated from the primary activities crosses the boundary of the premises.

Monitoring during time limited operations

- 9. Within 7 days of time limited operations of each of the mobile screening plant and the mobile crushing plant, the works approval holder must retain the services of a person qualified and experienced in the area of environmental noise assessment and who by their qualifications and experience is eligible to hold membership of the Australian Acoustical Society or the Australian Association of Acoustical Consultants to:
 - (a) investigate the nature and extent of noise emissions from the premises including undertaking noise monitoring during normal operations at the boundary of the closest noise sensitive receptor.
 - (b) assess in accordance with the methodology required in the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997*, the compliance of the noise emissions from the primary activities, against the relevant assigned levels specified in those Regulations; and

(c) compile and submit to the works approval holder within three months of the commencement date of time limited operations a report in accordance with condition 10.

Compliance reporting – noise assessment

- **10.** A report prepared pursuant to condition 9(c) is to include:
 - (a) a description of the methods used for monitoring of noise emissions from the premises;
 - (b) details and the results of the investigation undertaken pursuant to condition 9(a);
 - (c) details and results of the assessment of the noise emissions from the premises against the relevant assigned levels in the *Environmental Protection* (Noise) Regulations 1997 undertaken pursuant to condition 9(b); and
 - (d) an assessment of noise levels against the most recent previous noise modelling assessment.
- 11. The works approval holder must submit to the CEO the report prepared pursuant to condition 9(c) within 7 days of receiving it.
- **12.** Where an assessment pursuant to condition 9 indicates that noise emissions do not comply with the relevant assigned levels in the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997*, the works approval holder must:
 - (a) cease time limited operations for the infrastructure specified in condition 1;
 - (b) within 14 days of receiving an assessment report pursuant to condition 9(c) prepare a plan to ensure the undertaking of the licensed activity will no longer lead to any contravention of the Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997: and
 - (c) provide to the CEO a copy of the plan prepared pursuant to condition 12(b) within 30 days of its preparation.
- **13.** A report prepared pursuant to condition 12(b) is to include timeframes for the completion of additional noise mitigation measures.
- 14. The works approval holder may recommence time limited operations of the infrastructure specified in condition 1 upon implementation of all noise mitigation measure identified in accordance with condition 12(b).
- 15. Where operations are recommended in accordance with condition 14, the works approval holder must notify the CEO in writing a minimum of 48 hours prior to recommencing time limited operations.

Compliance reporting – Time limited operations

- **16.** The works approval holder must submit to the CEO a report on the time limited operations within 30 calendar days of the completion date of time limited operations.
- **17.** The works approval holder must ensure the report required by condition 16 includes the following:
 - (a) a summary of the time limited operations, including timeframes and amount of material processed
 - (b) a summary of the environmental performance of all infrastructure as constructed or installed:

- (c) a review of performance and compliance against the conditions of the works approval; and
- (d) where the manufacturer's design specifications and the conditions of this works approval have not been met, what measures will the works approval holder take to meet them, and what timeframes will be required to implement those measures.

Records and reporting (general)

- 18. The works approval holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the works approval holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the works approval holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **19.** The works approval holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this works approval:
 - (a) the works conducted in accordance with condition 1; and
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 6.
- **20.** The books specified under condition 19 must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) be retained by the works approval holder for the duration of the works approval; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
