### Interpretation

In this works approval:

- (a) the words 'including', 'includes' and 'include' in conditions mean "including but not limited to", and similar, as appropriate;
- (b) where any word or phrase is given a defined meaning, any other part of speech or other grammatical form of that word or phrase has a corresponding meaning;
- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition:
- (d) any reference to an Australian or other standard, guideline, or code of practice in this works approval:
  - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
  - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

**NOTE:** This works approval requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this works approval.

### Works approval conditions

The works approval holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

#### **Construction phase**

#### Infrastructure and equipment

- **1.** The works approval holder must:
  - (a) construct the infrastructure;
  - (b) in accordance with the corresponding design and construction requirements;
  - (c) at the corresponding infrastructure location; as set out in Table 1.

#### **Compliance reporting**

- 2. The works approval holder must within 30 calendar days of an item of infrastructure required by condition 1 being constructed:
  - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the requirements of condition 1; and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Environmental Compliance Report on that compliance.
- **3.** The Environmental Compliance Report required by condition 2, must include as a minimum the following:
  - (a) photographic evidence and a detailed site plan for the item of infrastructure specified in condition 1; and
  - (b) be signed by a person authorised to represent the works approval holder and contains the printed name and position of that person.

### **Time limited operations phase**

#### **Commencement and duration**

- 4. The works approval holder may only commence time limited operations for an item of infrastructure identified in condition 1 where the Environmental Compliance Report as required by condition 3 has been submitted by the works approval holder for that item of infrastructure.
- **5.** The works approval holder may conduct time limited operations for an item of infrastructure specified in condition 1:
  - (a) for a period not exceeding 180 calendar days from the day the works approval holder meets the requirements of condition 4 for that item of infrastructure; or
  - (b) until such time as a licence amendment for that item of infrastructure is granted in accordance with Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, if one is granted before the end of the period specified in condition 5(a).

6. The works approval holder must ensure that the premises infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 2 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 2.

Table 2: Operational requirements during time limited operations

Infrastructure	Operational requirements
Storage tank	To be operated and maintained as free of leaks and defects to hold up to 300 kL.

#### Waste acceptance and processing

7. The works approval holder must only accept onto the premises waste of a waste type, which does not exceed the corresponding rate at which waste is received, and which meets the corresponding acceptance specification set out in Table 3.

**8.** The works approval holder must ensure that the waste types specified in Table 4 are only subjected to the corresponding processes, process limits and/or specifications.

Sewage	Physical and biological treatment	Treatment of sewage must not exceed the treatment capacity of 900 m³ per day (as a monthly average)

- **9.** The works approval holder shall immediately recover, or remove and dispose of, spills of sewage or treated wastewater, whether inside or outside an engineered containment system.
- **10.** The works approval holder shall ensure that all material used for the recovery, removal, and/or disposal of sewage or treated wastewater is stored in an impermeable container prior to disposal at an appropriately authorised facility.

#### **Emissions and limits**

- 11. The works approval holder must manage and operate the premises such that odours emanating from the premises do not unreasonably interfere with the health, welfare, convenience, comfort or amenity of any person.
- **12.** The works approval holder must ensure that the emissions specified in Table 5, are discharged only from the corresponding discharge points, at the discharge locations and subjected to the corresponding specifications.

13. The works approval holder must ensure that the emissions from the discharge point listed in Table 6 do not exceed the corresponding limits when monitored in accordance with condition 19.

#### **Monitoring during time limited operations**

- **14.** The works approval holder must ensure that:
  - (a) all water samples are collected and preserved in accordance with AS/NZS 5667.1;
  - (b) all surface water sampling is conducted in accordance with AS/NZS 5667.6;
  - (c) all wastewater sampling is conducted in accordance with AS/NZS 5667.10;
  - (d) all groundwater sampling is conducted in accordance with AS/NZS 5667.11;
  - (e) all microbial samples are collected and preserved in accordance with AS/NZS 2031:
  - (f) all sample analysis must be undertaken by laboratories with current accreditation from the National Association of Testing Authorities (NATA) for the relevant parameters, unless indicated otherwise in the relevant table.
- **15.** The works approval holder must ensure that:
  - (a) monitoring is undertaken in each monthly period such that there are at least 15 days in between the days on which samples are taken in successive months;
  - (b) monitoring is undertaken in each quarterly period such that there are at least 45 days in between the days on which samples are taken in successive quarters; and
  - (c) monitoring is undertaken in each six-monthly period such that there are at least 5 months in between the days on which samples are taken in successive six-monthly periods.
- **16.** The works approval holder must ensure that all monitoring equipment used to comply with conditions 18 and 19 are operated and calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- 17. The works approval holder must, where the requirements for calibration cannot be practicably met, or a discrepancy exists in the interpretation of the requirements, bring these issues to the attention of the CEO accompanied with a report comprising details of any modifications to the methods.

**18.** The works approval holder must undertake the monitoring of inputs and outputs in accordance with Table 7.

**19.** The works approval holder must undertake the monitoring of treated wastewater in accordance with Table 8.

#### **Records and reporting**

- **20.** The works approval holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the works approval holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
  - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
  - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
  - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
  - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the works approval holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **21.** The works approval holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this works approval:
  - (a) the works conducted in accordance with condition 1;
  - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 6:
  - (c) monitoring programmes undertaken in accordance with conditions 18 and 19;
  - (d) monthly average data in kg/ha/day and kg/ha/year for each contaminant (excluding pH and *E. coli*) in treated wastewater discharged from the premises; and
  - (e) complaints received under condition 20.
- **22.** The books specified under condition 21 must:
  - (a) be legible;
  - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
  - (c) be retained by the works approval holder for the duration of the works approval; and
  - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
- 23. The works approval holder must submit to the CEO a report on the time limited operations within 30 calendar days of the completion date of time limited operations or 30 calendar days before the expiration date of the works approval, whichever is the sooner
- **24.** The works approval holder must ensure the report required by condition 23 includes the following:
  - (a) a summary of the information contained in condition 21;
  - (b) a summary of the environmental performance of all infrastructure as constructed;
  - (c) a review of performance and compliance against the conditions of the works approval; and
  - (d) where the manufacturer's design specifications and the conditions of this works approval have not been met, what measures will the works approval holder take to meet them, and what timeframes will be required to implement those measures.




Figure 2: Premises schematic diagram




Figure 3: Infrastructure installation location.
