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1. **Decision summary**

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to Licence L4612/1989/11. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the Premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This Amendment Report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The decision report for the Existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <u>https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents</u>.

2.2 Application summary

Licence L4612/1989/11 is held by BHP Nickel West Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) for the Nickel West Leinster Nickel Operations (the Premises), located on several mining tenements near Leinster, Western Australia.

The Premises relates to the categories and the assessed production/design capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987* (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing Licence L4612/1989/11.

On 15 November 2024, the Licence Holder submitted an application to the department to amend Licence L4612/1989/11 under section 59B of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act). The proposed amendments (Table 1) are limited to changes to support and reflect temporary suspension of operations at the premises, other minor amendments and correcting the table numbers.

The licence holder advised that operations at the premises will enter a period of temporary suspension until February 2027, when the situation will be re-assessed. Several projects and maintenance activities have commenced, mainly related to water management on and around the tailings storage facilities at the premises.

3. Assessment

Table 1 below provides a summary of the licence holder proposed amendments and the department's decision regarding each proposed amendment.
