1. Decision summary

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to Licence L6146/1990/12. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the Premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This Amendment Report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The decision report for the Existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents>.

2.2 Amendment summary

Licence L6146/1990/12 is held by Meneghello Galvanizing Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) for MGalv (the Premises), located at 46 Rogers Way, Landsdale WA.

The Premises relates to the category and the assessed production capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987* (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing Licence L6146/1990/12.

On 6 May 2026, the department initiated an amendment to Licence L6146/1990/12. The amendment is limited to extending works approval/licence expiry date.

The licence is currently due to expire on 31 August 2026. On 13 October 2025, the Licence Holder submitted a licence amendment application to the department seeking, among other matters, an extension of the licence expiry date. The applicant has also advised that the premises are expected to cease operations in approximately one year.

As an amendment application has already been lodged, the department has initiated a separate amendment solely to extend the licence expiry date by one year. This is to allow sufficient time for the department to assess the conditions associated with the existing amendment application.

3. Consultation

The Licence Holder was provided with a draft amendment report on 15 May 2026. On 15 May 2026 the Licence Holder waived the comment period.

4. Conclusion

Based on the assessment in this Amendment Report, the Delegated Officer has determined that an amended licence will be granted, subject to conditions commensurate with the determined controls and necessary for administration and reporting requirements.

4.1 Summary of amendments
