Amendment description

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to licence L7413/1998/9. The amendment is administrative in nature therefore does not alter the risk profile of the premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing licence remain unchanged.

This amendment report documents the amendment made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents>.

Background

Licence L7413/1998/9 is held by Cretta Pty Ltd (licence holder) for the Howard Park Wines (premises), located at 543 Miamup Road, Cowaramup WA 6284 within the Shire of Augusta-Margret River.

The premises relates to the production of alcoholic beverage manufacturing and the assessed 3,200 kL per annual period capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987* (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing licence L7413/1998/9.

On 15 December 2023 DWER received an application for a renewal to licence L7413/1998/9. To provide sufficient time to complete the assessment of the application the department has initiated an amendment to the expiry date for licence L7413/1998/9 which is due to expire 23 February 2024. The amendment is limited to extending licence expiry date therefore no new risk assessment is required.

Consultation

The licence holder was provided with the draft amendment report on 09 January 2024. No comment was received from the licence holder.

Decision

Based on the assessment in this amendment report, the delegated officer has amended licence L7413/1998/9 to extend the expiry date by 12 months.

The decision report for the existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.
