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1. Decision summary

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to licence L7427/1998/8. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This amendment report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The revised licence issued through this amendment consolidates and supersedes the existing licence previously granted in relation to the premises. The revised licence corrects a typographical error made in the previous revision.

The amendment report for the existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <u>https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents</u>.

2.2 Amendment summary

Licence L7427/1998/8 is held by the Water Corporation (licence holder) for the Dunsborough Water Resource Recovery Facility (the premises), located at Lot 150 on Diagram 100538, Anniebrook Road, Anniebrook.

On 5 December 2024, the licence holder contacted the department regarding an error identified in the existing licence. The error appeared to have occurred in the translation of irrigation discharge loading limits for 5-day biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) during the previous amendment to align Annual Environmental Report (AER) and Annual Audit Compliance Report (AACR) reporting dates, and to alter the premises name. A loading limit of 30 kilograms per hectare per day was mistakenly changed to 30kg/ha/year. This department-initiated amendment is limited only to correcting this typographical error.

No changes to the aspects of the existing licence relating to Category 54 and Category 61 are being made. Table 1 below outlines the current approved production/design capacity for the Premises under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations* 1987 (EP Regulations).
