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1. Decision summary

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to Licence L8831/2014/2. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the Premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This Amendment Report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The decision report for the Existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents>.

2.2 Amendment summary

Licence L8831/2014/2 is held by B. & J. Catalano Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) for the Myalup Limestone Quarry (the Premises), located at 4 Ludlow Road MYALUP WA 6220.

The Premises relates to the category 12 and the assessed production capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987* (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing Licence L8831/2014/2.

There is an application currently under assessment for the renewal of licence L8831/2014/2 however, given the existing licence expiry date, the Department decided to process a CEO Initiated amendment to allow sufficient time to undertake the renewal assessment currently in the public consultation period. Given the current renewal is still being advertised, the short-term extension to allow time to consider any consultation regarding the extension of the licence for an even greater period of time is not considered as requiring advertising separately.

On 11 June 2025, the department initiated an amendment to Licence L8831/2014/2. The amendment is limited to extending licence expiry date until 16 September 2025.

3. Consultation

The Licence Holder was provided with the draft Amendment Report on 11 June 2025. On 12 June 2025 the Licence Holder waived the comment period.

4. Conclusion

Based on the assessment in this Amendment Report, the Delegated Officer has determined that an amended licence will be granted, subject to conditions commensurate with the determined controls and necessary for administration and reporting requirements.

4.1 Summary of amendments
