1. Decision summary

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to Works Approval W6211/2019/1. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the Premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This Amendment Report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The decision report for the Existing works approval will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the works approval, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

2.2 Amendment summary

Works Approval W6211/2019/1 is held by Boral Resources (WA) Pty Ltd (Works Approval Holder) for the Boral Newman Quarry (the Premises), located within Mining Lease M52/1076, approximately 30km south of Newman adjacent to the Great Northern Highway.

The Premises will consist of a quarry plus a crushing and screening plant, and supporting infrastructure. Personnel are accommodated onsite in a temporary accommodation village.

The Premises will operate as a "campaign-style" program where excavation and crushing is intermittent. The length of each campaign will be dependent on local demand for aggregate products. Material will be stockpiled from the excavation and crushing campaign and will remain stockpiled until required when it will be recovered from the stockpiles, loaded and transported off-site. Product will be stored in a dedicated area located to the east and south of the quarry.

The Premises relates to the category and the assessed production capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987* (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing Works Approval W6211/2019/1.

On 15 July 2021, the Works Approval Holder submitted an application to the department to amend Works Approval W6211/2019/1 under section 59B of the *Environmental Protection Act* 1986 (EP Act). The amendment is limited only to extending the works approval expiry date.

The Works Approval Holder has been delayed in starting the project and cannot complete construction activities given the current expiry date. The Delegated Officer considers that the conditions of the works approval remain appropriate and therefore an extension to the expiry date is acceptable.

3. Consultation

The Works Approval Holder was provided with the draft Amendment Report on 25 October 2021. No comments were received.

4. Conclusion

Based on the assessment in this Amendment Report, the Delegated Officer has determined that an amended works approval will be granted, with an extended expiry date of 23 February 2027, subject to conditions commensurate with the determined controls and necessary for administration and reporting requirements.

4.1 Summary of amendments

Table 1 below provides a summary of the proposed amendments and will act as a record of implemented changes. All proposed changes have been incorporated into the Revised works approval as part of the amendment process.
