

**Derby and Fitzroy Crossing Waste Management Facility Annual Environmental Report and Annual Audit Compliance Report**

Fitzroy Crossing 01/01/2021- 31/12/2021

- There were no pollution control equipment failures in Fitzroy Crossing last year
  - There were no fires at the Fitzroy Crossing WMF
  - Dust suppression measures remain exactly as set out in last year, report
  - The control of windblown waste in Fitzroy Crossing remains exactly as set out in last year's report
  - There is no reason why the compaction rate of 300-400kg/cubic metre would have changed. There is no significant increase in volumes
  - No complaints were logged
  - Site boundaries have not changed during the year. They remain the same.
  - Only the Shire can run reports on Cooee. However, there would not have been an increase in asbestos waste deposited.
  - There is no Clinical Waste cell
  - Fitzroy Crossing does not accept liquid waste
  - Total volume of waste buried remains well below 10,000 tonnes.
  - Rejected loads are very much a thing of the past. Everybody knows that we do not have a hydrocarbon licence.
